



Avulsion

- Primary concerns are: 1) pulpal necrosis 2) attachment damage.
- Immediate replantation leads to best prognosis.
- Milk is great storage media if immediate replantation is not possible.
- Any tooth that has been dry for more than 60 minutes has a poor long-term prognosis.
- RCT is always indicated if avulsed tooth is mature with closed apex. RCT is best initiated 7-10 days following replantation.
- Immature teeth with open apices can spontaneously revascularize. RCT should be avoided until clinical and/or radiographic evidence of pulpal necrosis exists.
- Stabilization for 7-10 days with a non-rigid splint is indicated only if teeth are mobile.
- Always inform of possible sequelae: inflammatory root resorption or ankylosis with replacement resorption.
